A SHORT SUMMARY OF THE PSALMS

(Gleaned from various sources)

[The Psalms are full of] Christ and His connection with future remnants of Israel in the last days (ie, the tribulation period) while anticipating His coming to deliver them from their enemies and blessing them in His kingdom. Also His previous like-sufferings and His sympathies realized in them by the Spirit in their trials. [They] are seldom chronological, ever moral; sacred rhythmical composition. Some [of the Psalms] were sung and accompanied by musical instruments. [Truly the heart of the Bible.]

The Psalms give reflections upon the ways of God by the Spirit of Christ in His own. They rise at times in their expressions up to the experiences of Christ Himself, and thus become directly prophetic. (First two paragraphs by AC Brown.)

The key to the whole book of the Psalms (per HE Hayhoe) is Psalm 94: 12 & 13 "Blessed is the man whom Thou chastenest, O LORD, and teachest him out of Thy law; that Thou mayest give him rest from the days of adversity, until the pit be digged for the wicked."
